

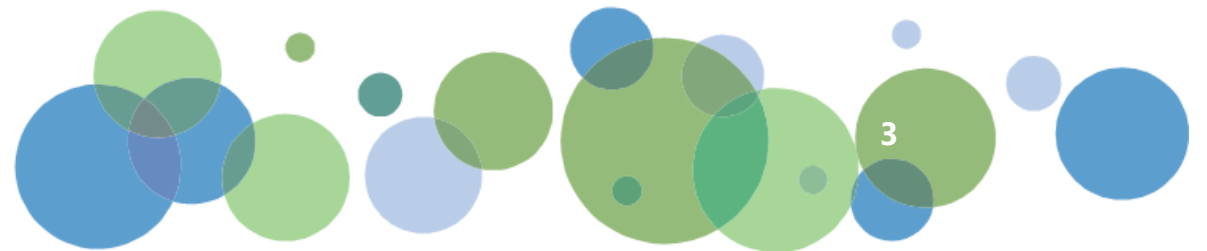
New Schools – Catchment Review opportunity

- ❑ 2 new schools being constructed to open in September 2022.
- ❑ Boundary / catchment lines need to be adjusted to create boundaries for the schools.
- ❑ District staff was tasked with providing recommendations for changes to boundary lines for our schools.
- ❑ District's long term Capital Plan was considered as we contemplated future changes, i.e. not moving boundaries more than once.
- ❑ Catchment change Guiding Principles were adopted by the Board in April 2020 based on input from the SD 62 community.



GUIDING PRINCIPLES

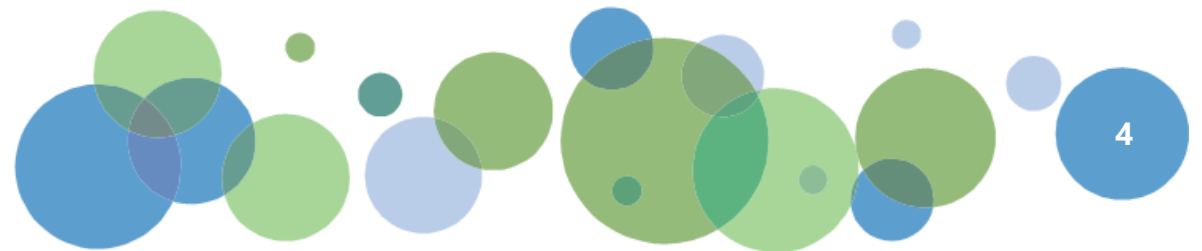
- Follow Board Policy F-502: School Catchment Areas and Student Placement
- Proximity to feeder schools;
- Maximize existing space in all schools
- Long-term sustainability
- Minimize crossing of major roadways and maximize on current and future safe and active routes to schools.
- Ensure equity of opportunity and clear K-12 pathways when reviewing programs of choice.
- Minimize disruptions to students.
- Grandparent students in their current schools. i.e. Families will have the choice to stay at their current school if they so choose.
- Provide stability and a transparent process with opportunities for robust public engagement.
- Use natural boundaries as much as possible.



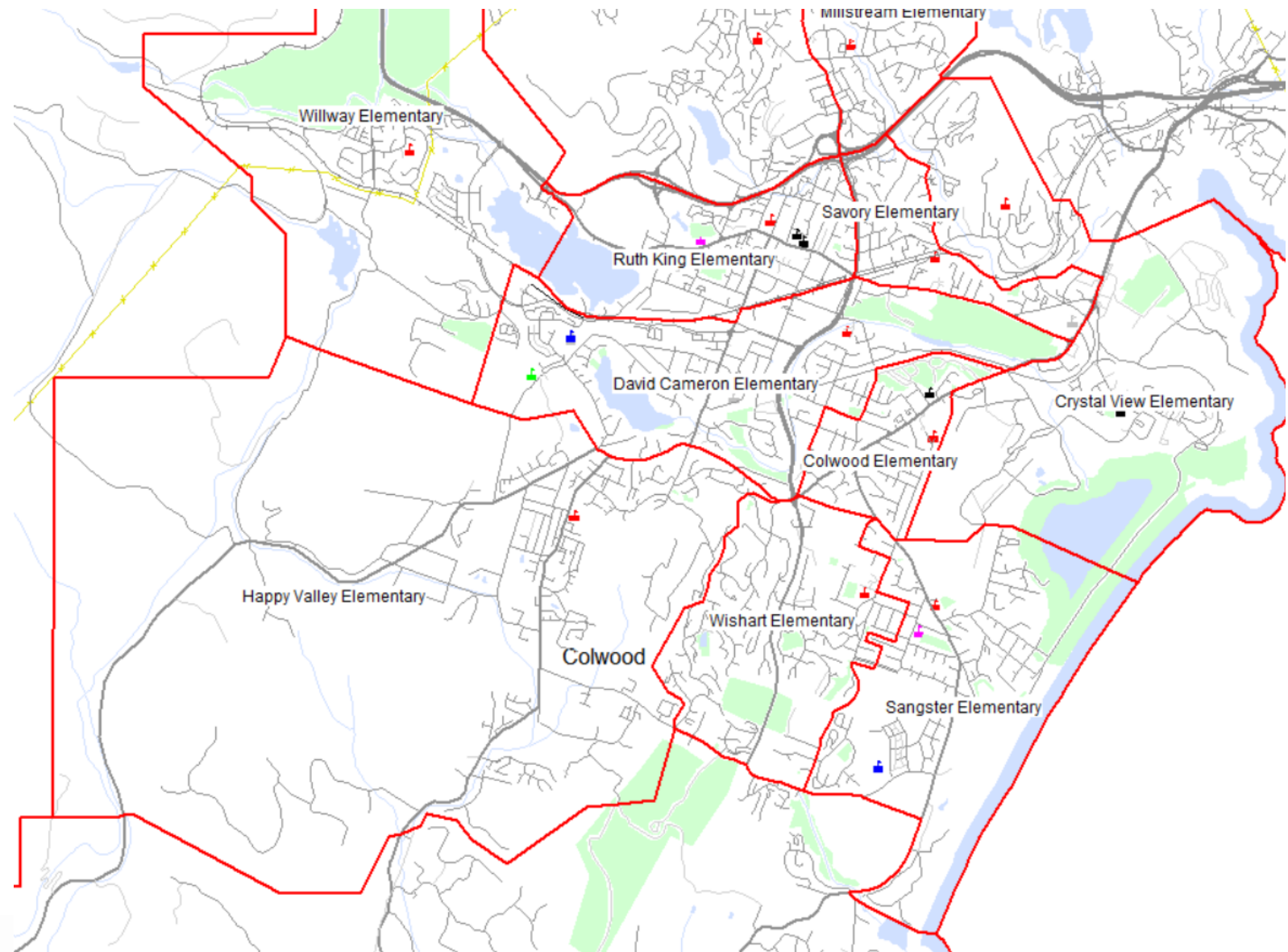

the Westshore Zone



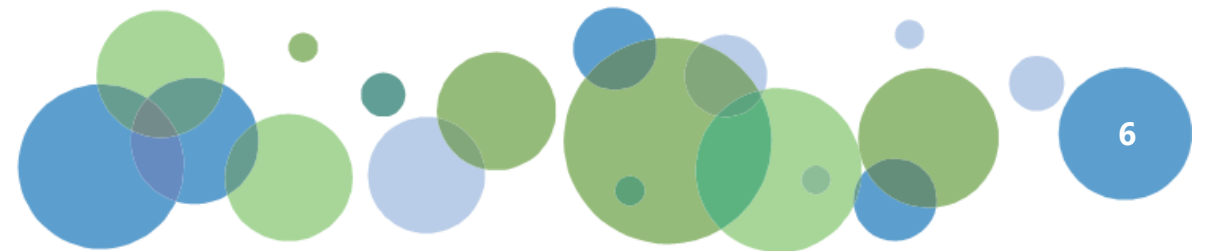

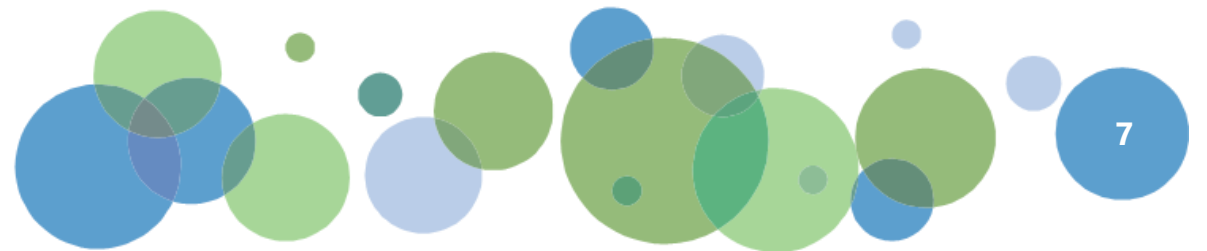

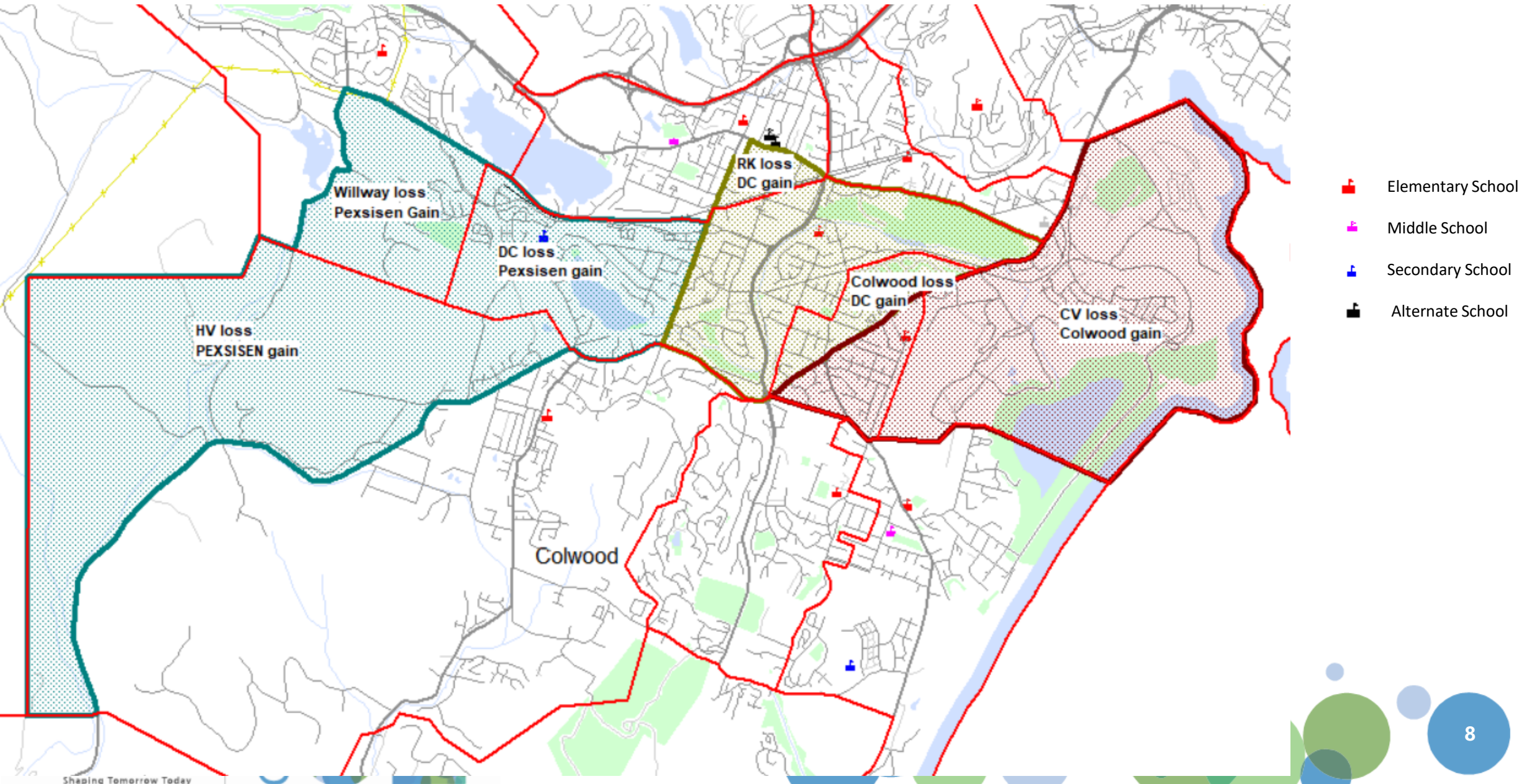

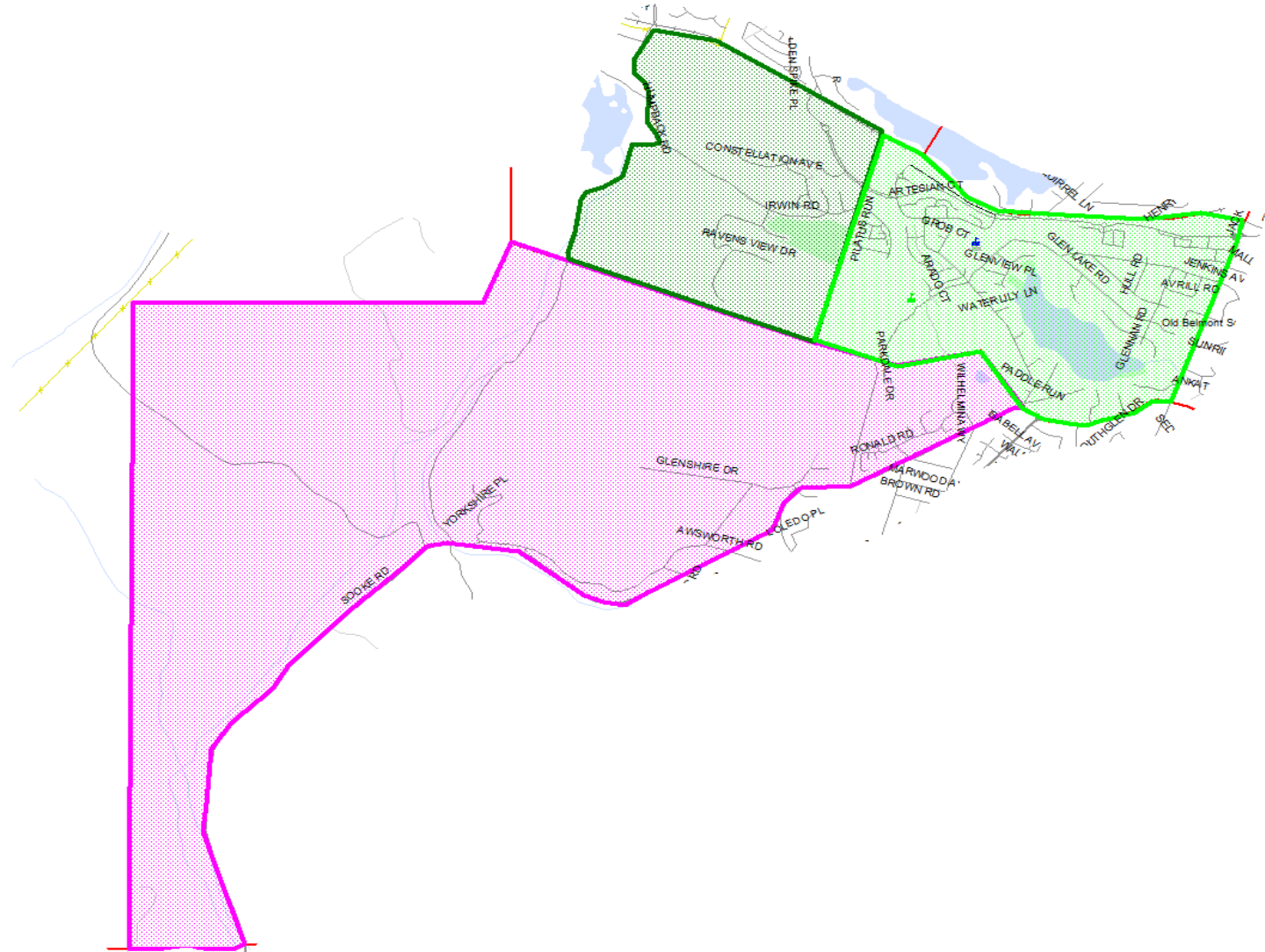
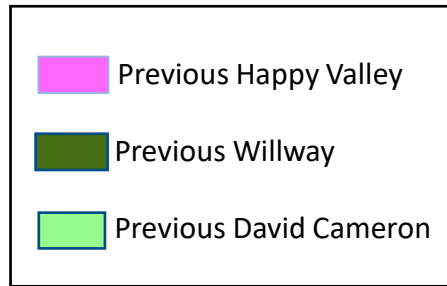
Regular Program Elementary Schools (English Programs only)



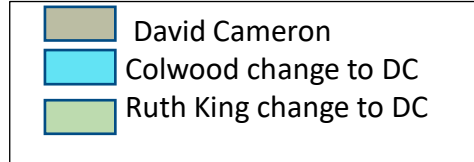
Regular Elementary Map with proposed changes



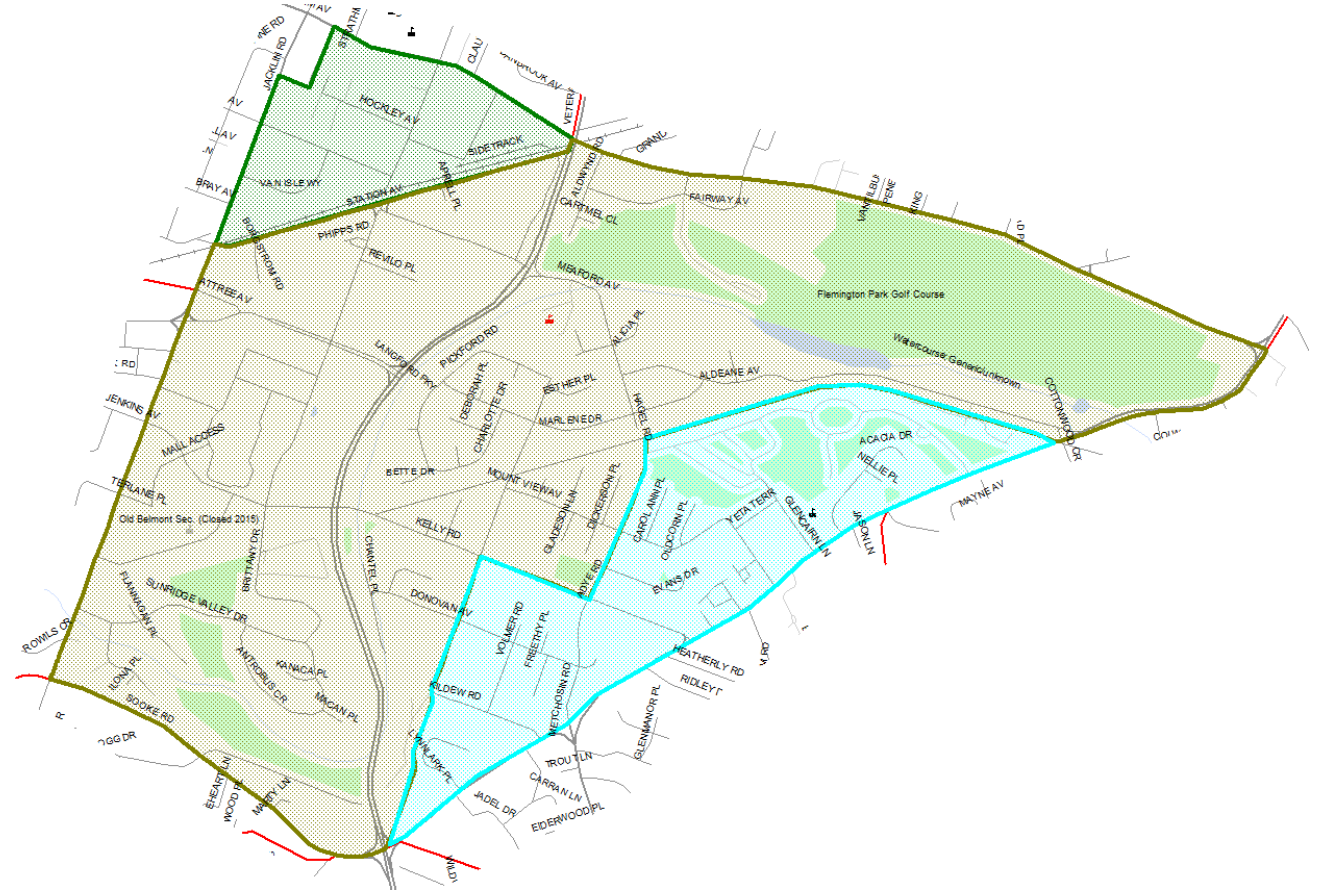
Pexsisen boundaries



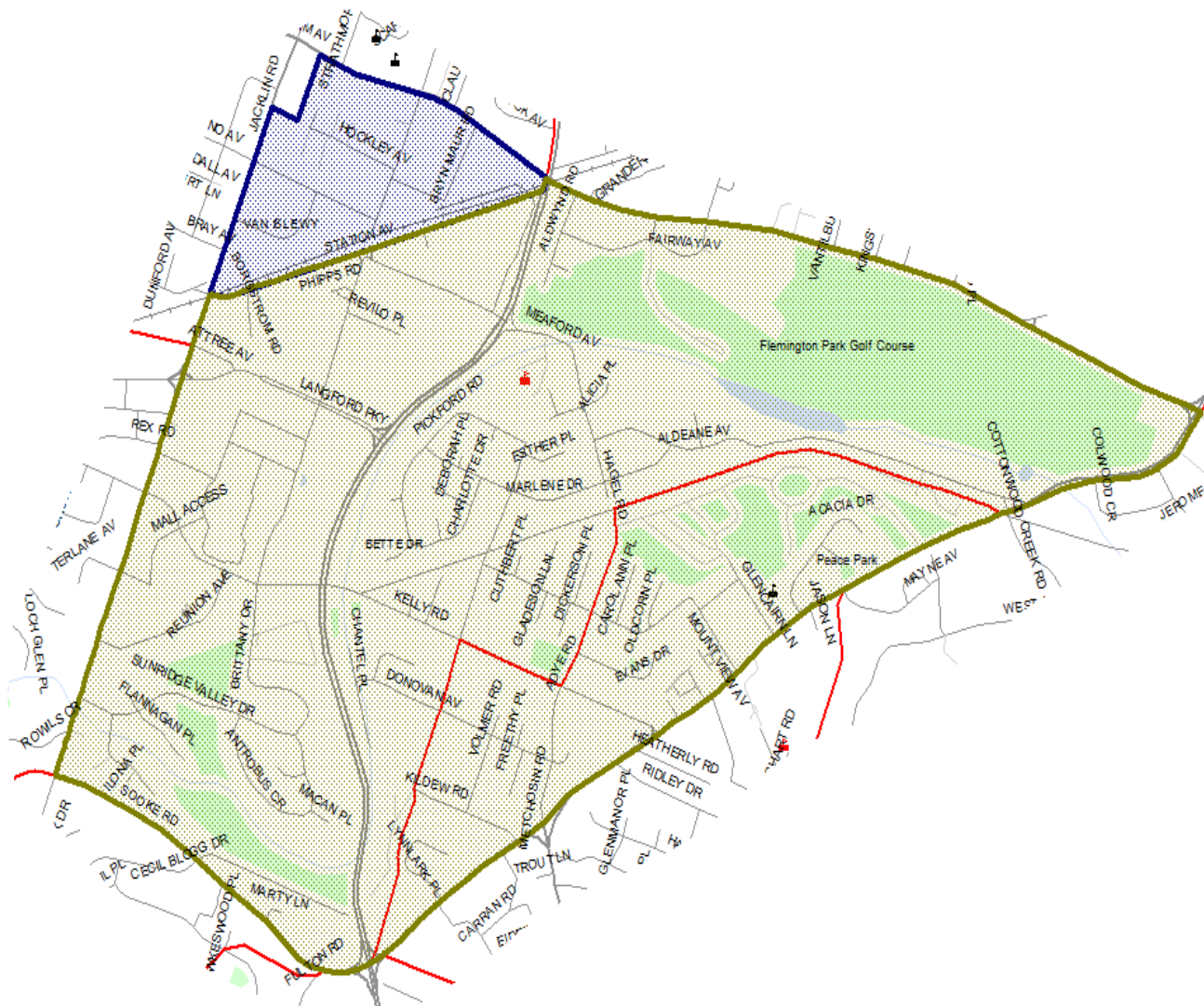
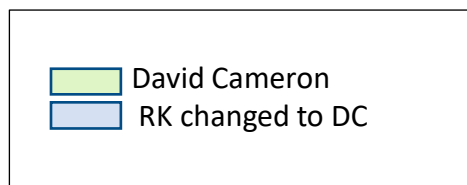

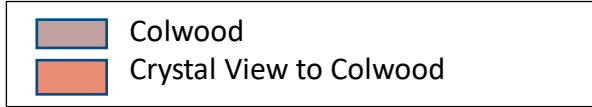
Ruth King to David Cameron



Colwood to David Cameron

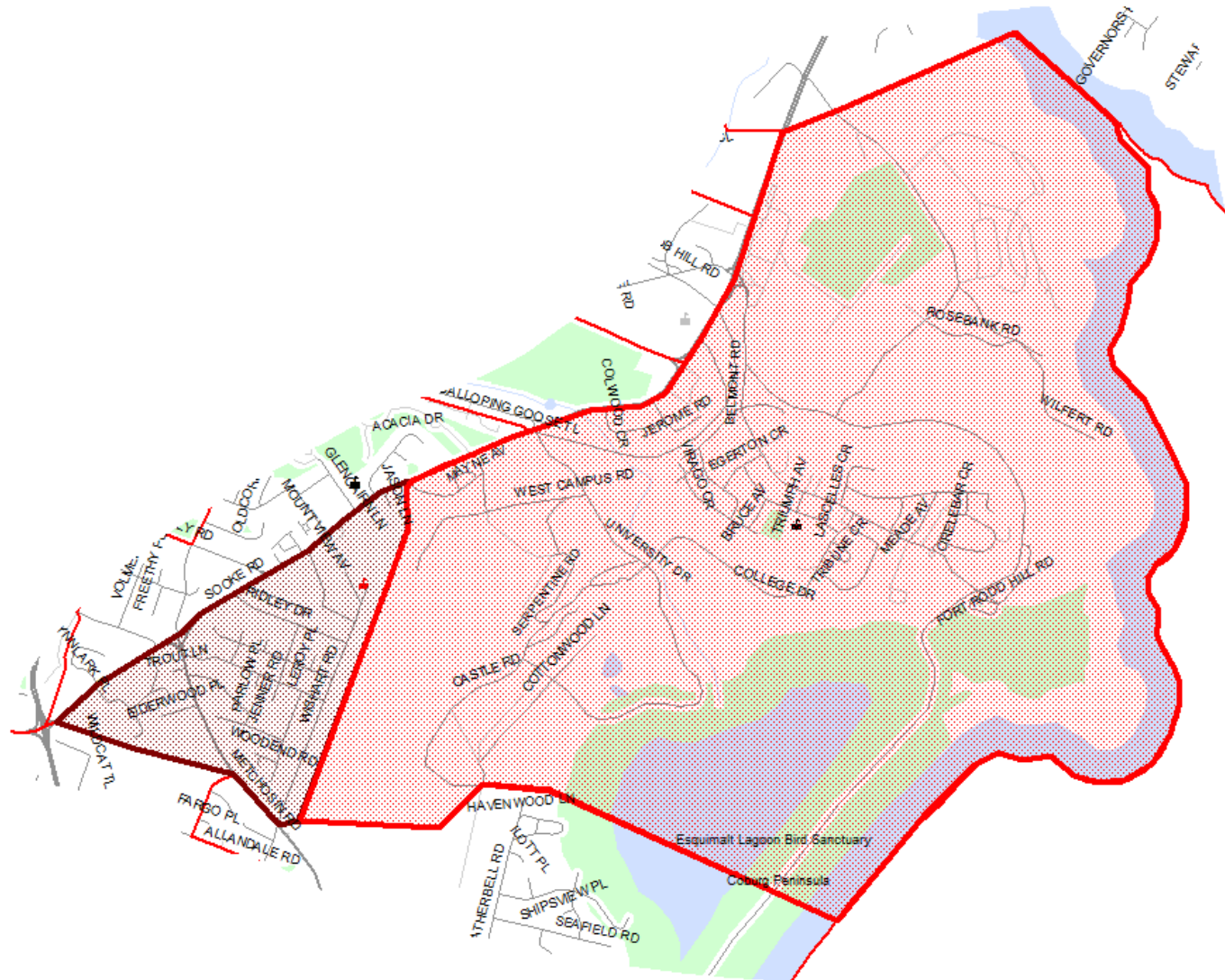

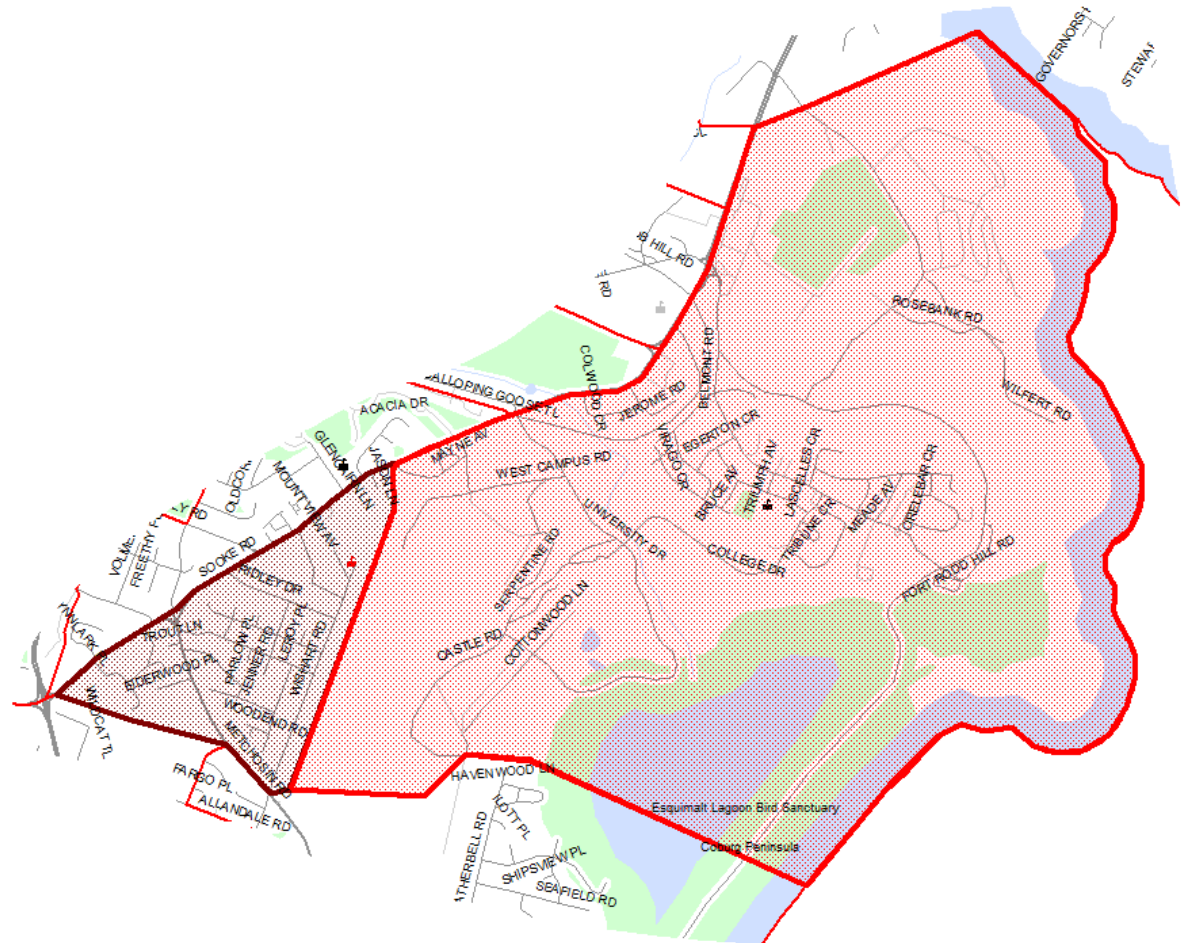
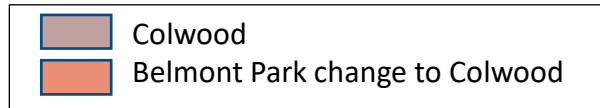


Boundary changes for Colwood would allow English program students from Belmont Park to attend an elementary school closer to their home.

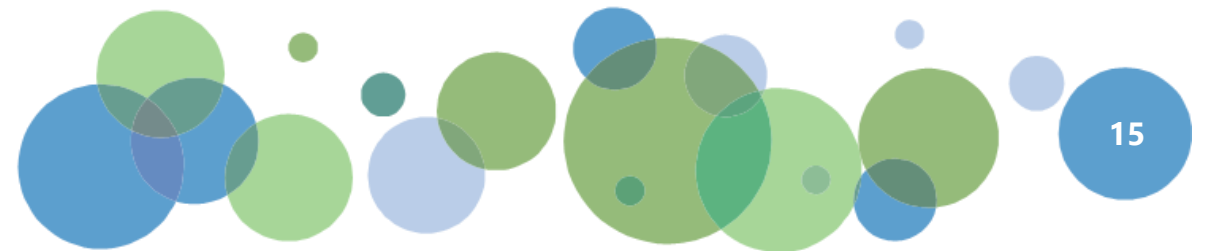
Please note, transportation routes will be adjusted to account for the new catchment boundaries.

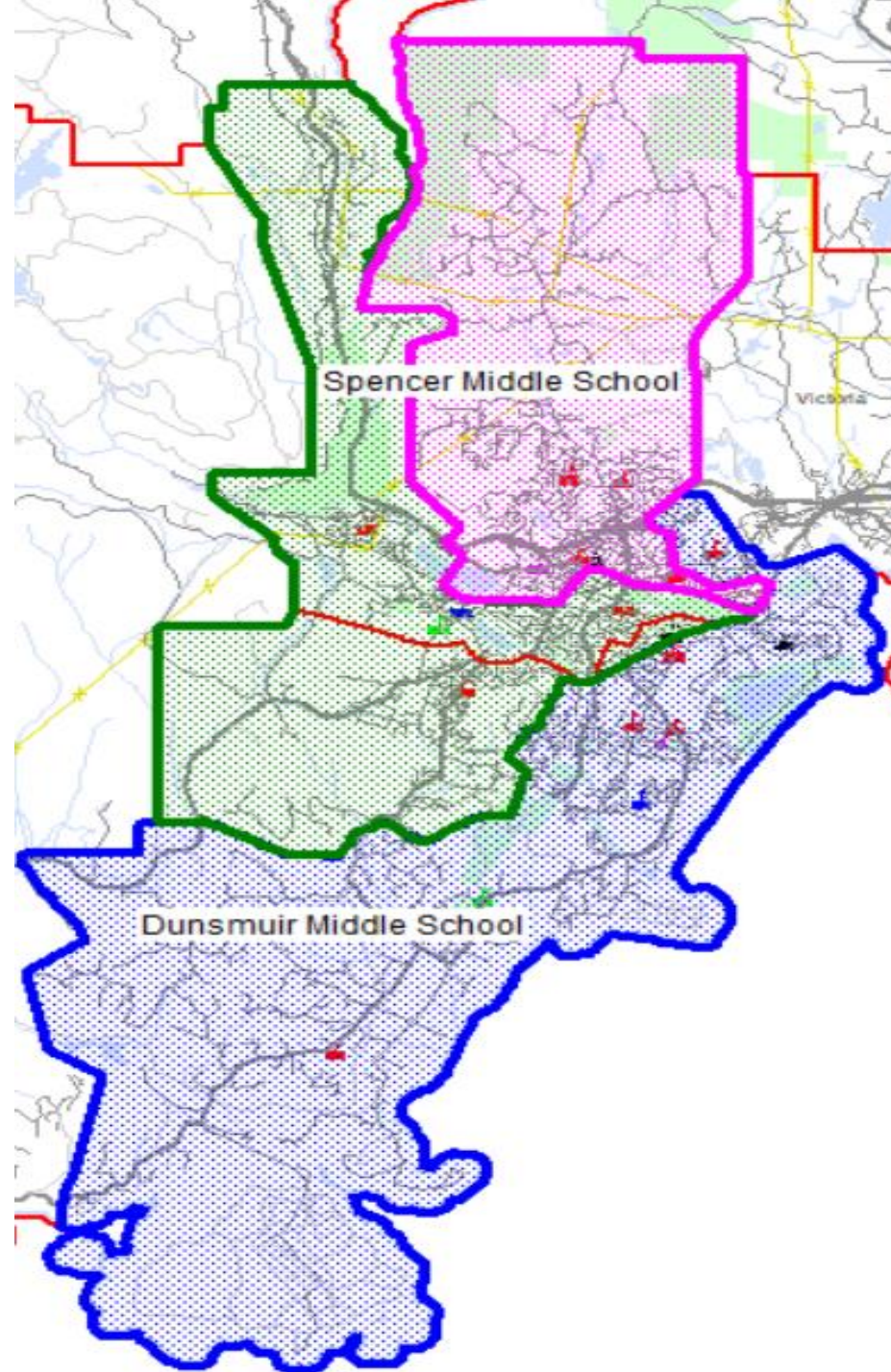

District Program Considerations French Immersion- Belmont Zone

balancing school populations

2021- Middle/ Secondary

- Move the French Immersion program to Royal Bay by gradually transitioning the program from Belmont.
- Grade 8 students at Ecole John Stubbs Middle will begin attending Royal Bay in Sept. 2021. French Immersion students currently attending Belmont will complete their dual dogwood at Belmont.

2022- Elementary

- French Immersion program at Millstream will move to Crystal View.

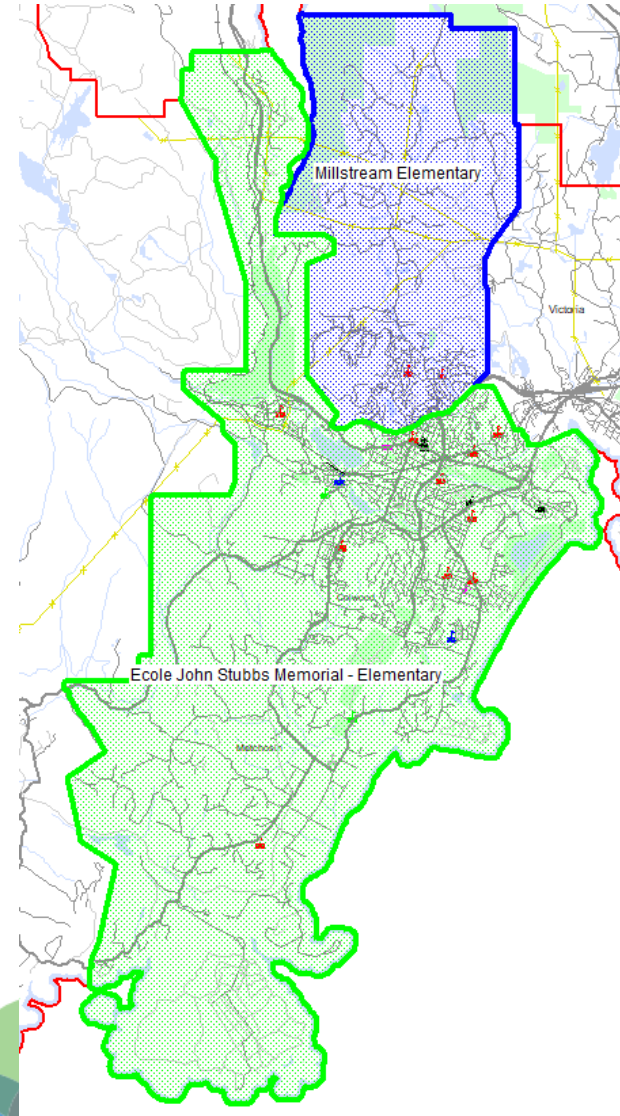


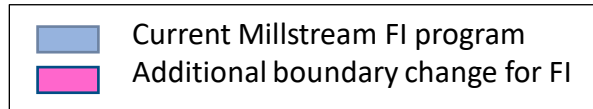
School Boundaries (with French Immersion changes)



Current FI Boundaries

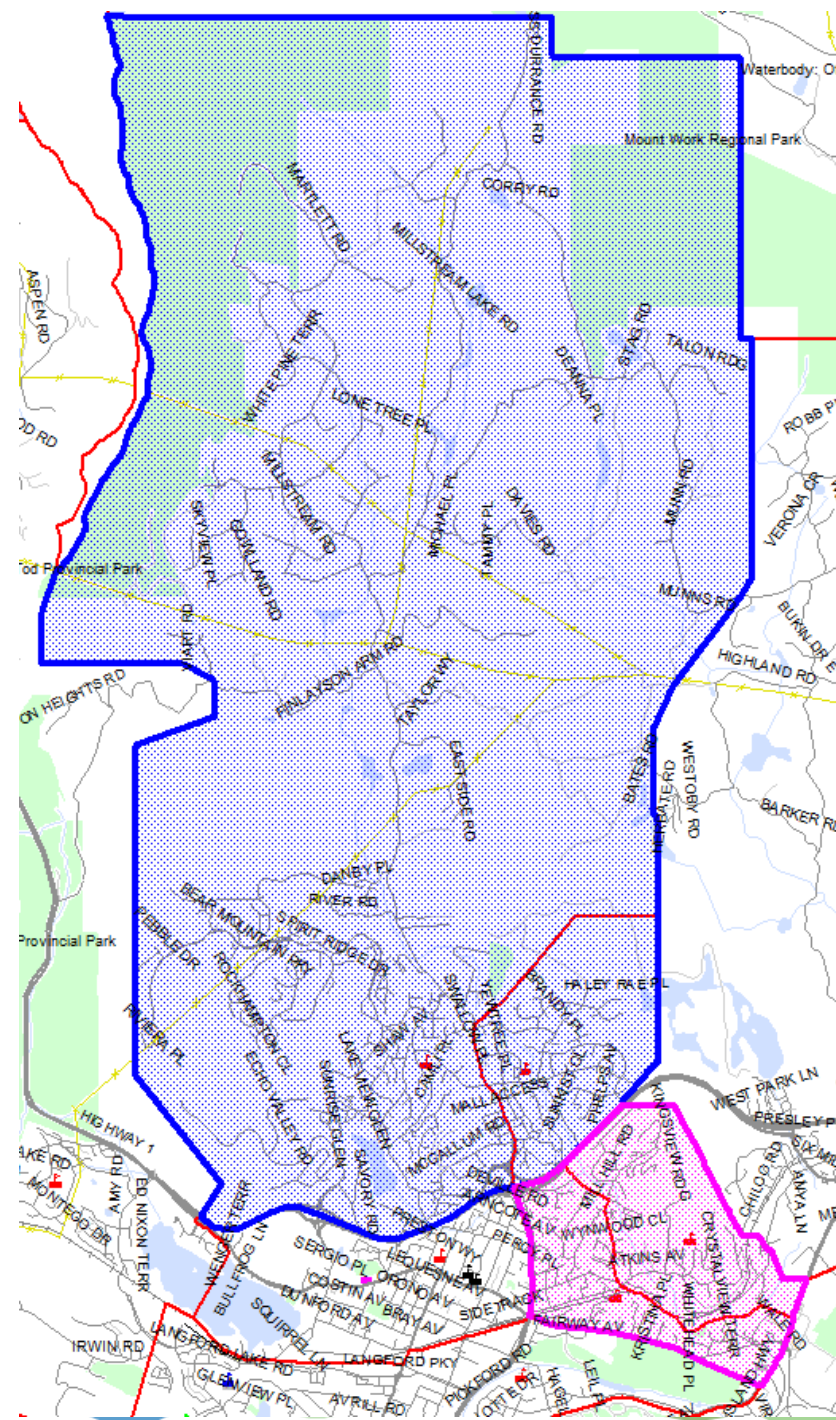
- Current Millstream FI program catchment

Elementary French Immersion Boundary change 2022

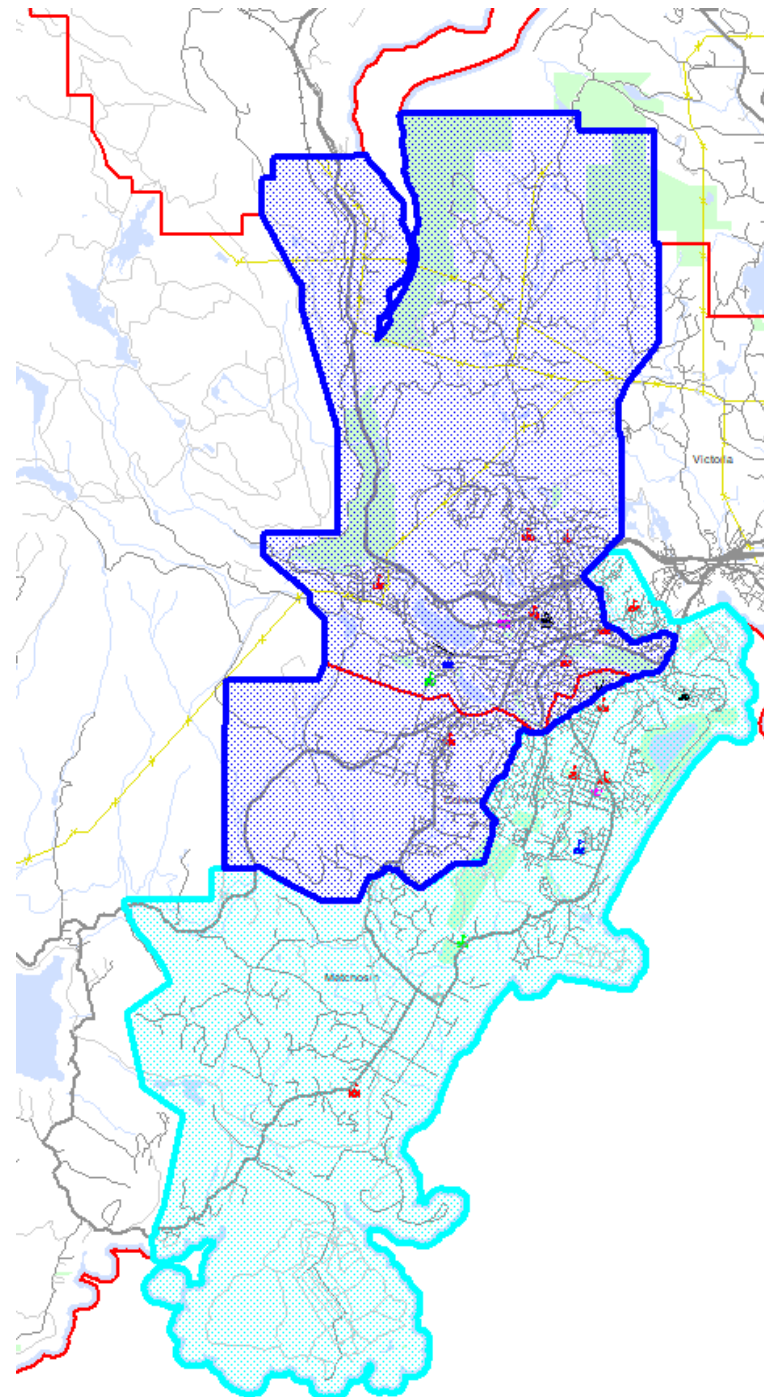
